



CE490 Applique Quilt Blocks

Hoops: Quilt Blocks fit 6 x 6 inches/150 x 150 mm

I used a white Poly-cotton for the entire square. I put a very thin Batting under the centre square fabric to give a slight puffy effect. The Tea-pots I did in different "pink" patterned poly-cottons. Tip: Cut the Batting a little smaller than the square outline, it prevents an untidy edge.

METHOD

1. Hoop 1 layer of Cut-Away Stabilizer.



Materials:

Poly-Cotton Fabric
plain and print of
your choice.

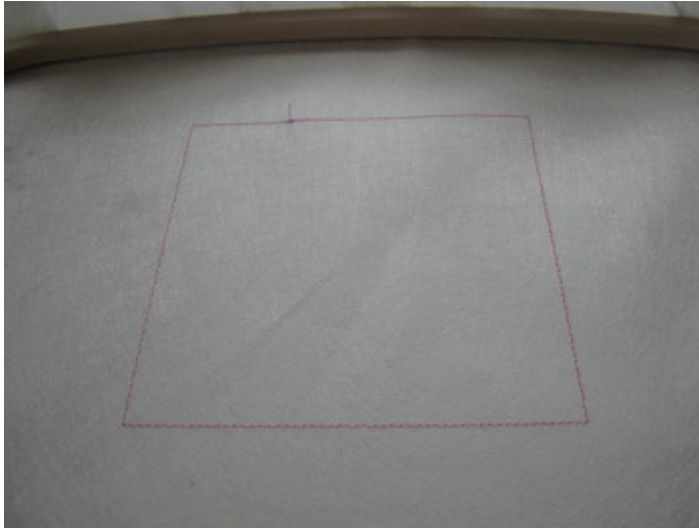
Optional: Thin
layer of Batting to
go under square
fabric

Cut-away
Stabilizer

Thread

embroidery
scissors and pins

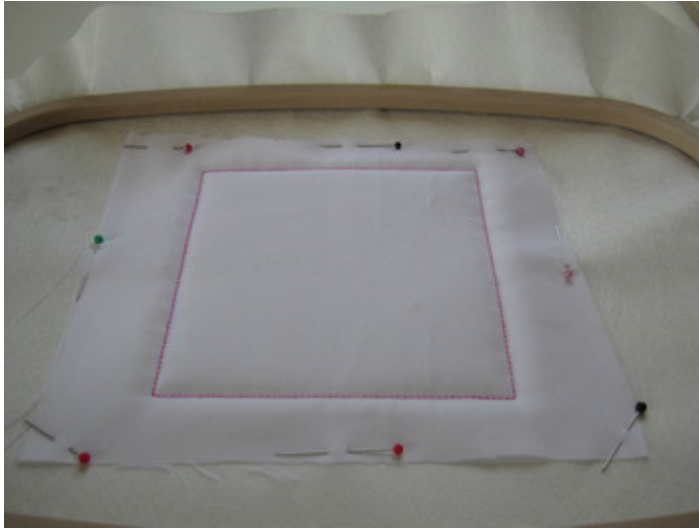
2. Stitch the outline of the inner square onto the stabilizer.



3. Place the batting over the outline.



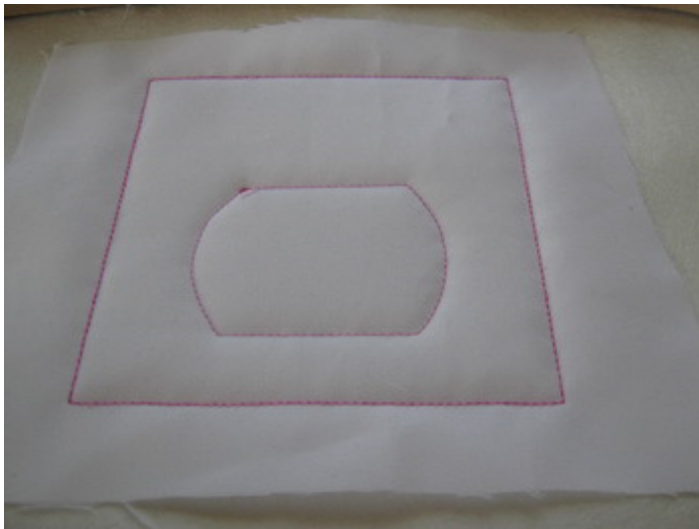
- 4. Cover the batting with your fabric square and pin in place. Pins must be away from the stitching area. Stitch in place.**



- 5. Trim away the excess batting (if any) underneath.**



- 6. Now stitch the outline of the "belly" of the tea-pot.**



7. Now cut a piece of fabric a little larger than the shape and pin in place.



8. Stitch in place.



9. Trim.



Please Note: Tea-pot CE490 003 has a little "Heart" appliqued onto the front of the tea-pot. When you have done the above, the machine will outline the heart. Cut a piece of contrasting fabric and place over the outline of the heart. Stitch in place, trim the Heart and continue stitching out the remainder of the tea-pot.

Here are the photos of the "Heart"



10. Now stitch the remainder of the tea-pot.



11. Now stitch the outline of the tea-pot. When the outline of the tea-pot is done the machine will stop. Cut a second piece of fabric the same size as the fabric on top. This will be the lining. Turn your Hoop over and pin the lining in place.



Next do the decorative edging. This will also attach the lining to the top.

12. Finally do a straight stitch outline right round the decorative edging. I did this in white to match my fabric.



13. Stitch as many squares as required to make your quilt.
