Summer Breeze Quilt Blocks 1
for CE779, CE780 and CE781

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Hi Friends,

Today we are going to make lovely, summer rose Quilt Blocks in anticipation of perfumed, balmy days ahead Gorgeous!

The Quilt Blocks come in 3 Hoop Sizes (HS) :

6"x6"/150mmx150mm
7"x7"/180mmx180mm
8"x8"/200mmx200mm

There are 14 Quilt Blocks per size, 2 of which are Accent Blocks - quilted only. Each size is individually priced.



What you will need

Hoop size: as per size above

No Stabilizer needed

Fabric and thin Batting sandwich:

For each size add 3" right round of fabric and batting for the quilt sandwich block to allow for hooping.

6x6 design - 18"x18" quilt sandwich - 12"x12" embroidered square

7x7 design - 20"x20" quilt sandwich - 14"x14" embroidered square

8x8 design - 22"x22" quilt sandwich - 16"x16" embroidered square

To make a Quilt Sandwich, cut 2 squares of cotton fabric and 1 square of thin batting. Lightly spray the fabric and batting with Madeira MSA1100 Fabric Temporary Spray Adhesive. Place the Batting between the fabric to create the sandwich.

Fade-out or wash-out Fabric Marker.



Make a print of the design. Cut out the design.



Make the sandwich.



Mark the centre of the square sandwich with the fade-out pencil. Using water soluble thread, hand stitch basting stitches along the fade-out pencil lines. You will have 4 quadrants.



Place the printout of the design into one of the corners working from the centre out. This is my first quadrant. It is at the top right. The arrow shows the centre of the design. Mark the centre with your fade-out pen. Continue working round the block, marking the centre of each design as you go. You will be placing 4 designs to make up the large block.



My second placing - top left quadrant.



My third placing - bottom left quadrant.



My fourth placing - bottom right quadrant.



I am starting with the first quadrant.
Hoop the sandwich using the marking lines as a guide. Make sure the fabric is straight in the hoop.
Get the centre of the first quadrant into the centre of the hoop.
Make sure that the marked lines on the fabric of the first quadrant match the centre notches on the hoop. (I am using a big hoop here but the method remains the same.)



This is my first quadrant that I am going to stitch out.

Your needle must be aligned with the centre of the design. Remove the print-out. Always trace your design before starting to make sure your design is in its correct place. Use your Colour Chart to stitch out the design. You will start with the quilting first and then move onto the colours of the roses and leaves.



Stitch the first design. When the design is stitched, simply re-hoop the sandwich with the next quadrant markings in the centre of the hoop and stitch the design. Continue in this way to complete the block.



First Block done! Now complete all your squares needed for your project.
